Ma Rainey

Born 1866 and died 1939 in the United States of America. Known as the 'mother of the Blues', her real name was Gertrude Pridgett. She was one of the first Blues singers to record music.



Blues music

Blues music often sounded sad because the people who sang it had a hard life. Singing made them feel better.

Popular instruments used in Blues music

Guitar, saxophone, harmonica, piano, double bass.



Key Vocabulary

pulse

A steady beat.

improvise

Use quick ideas - try out different sounds.

timbre

The different sounds instruments can make, blowing, hitting, scraping.

symbol

A picture to represent a sound or how to play.

blues

A style of music which started in America.

conductor

Someone who decides when and how a group/orchestra plays.

percussion

An instrument you can hit, shake or scrape to make a sound.

record

To save music to listen to again later. Might be on an iPad/Chromebook/record player.

harmonica

A wind instrument played by blowing or sucking air through it.

saxophone

A woodwind instrument made of a curved metal tube with a narrower part that is blown into and keys that are pressed to make different notes.

guitar

A six stringed instrument.

record player

Used before CDs were invented.
