Develop a character over a story arc.


Explore different story structures including flashbacks.

Maths

Addition and subtraction – solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems, use rounding to check answers, use column method to solve addition and subtraction questions using numbers up to 4 digits.

Multiplication and division – recognise and use square and cube numbers, factors and multiples; solve problems including all of the above; use written methods to multiply and divide 4 digit numbers.

Fractions, decimals and percentages – add and subtract fractions with the same denominator, recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert between the two, solve problems that involve converting between fractions, decimals and percentages.

Statistics – complete, read and interpret information in tables.

Understand that global warming will impact people differently across the globe.

Know the key geographical features of coasts.

Understand what causes coastal erosion, longshore drift and their effect on Walton-on-the-Naze.
