## Where are we in the World

### Physical Features

<b>woodland</b>	An area covered with trees.
<b>cliff</b>	A vertical or very steep natural wall of rock.
<b>beach</b>	A landform found along the coast of an ocean, sea or lake.
<b>island</b>	Areas of land not connected to a continent and surrounded by sea.

### Human Features

<b>house</b>	A building that people live in.
<b>shop</b>	A place where people can buy things.
<b>port</b>	A place where boats can be stored, load and unload people and goods, and moor.
<b>harbour</b>	A sheltered place on the coast for boats. Can be man made or natural.
<b>road</b>	Vehicles travel on strips of land called roads.
<b>school</b>	A place for teaching and learning.



### Key Places

<b>Grange Park Primary School</b>	A place of teaching and learning for children aged 4 to 11. The school is situated in Enfield.
<b>Highlands Village</b>	Originally a hospital. In the 1990s it was converted into flats and houses.
<b>Isles of Scilly</b>	The isles lie just off the coast of Cornwall. 2153 people live there.
<b>United Kingdom</b>	A country of Western Europe made up of four parts, England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.



### Key Vocabulary

<b>globe</b>	A globe is a model of Earth in the shape of a sphere.
<b>location</b>	A site or position. The description of where something is in relation to its surroundings.
<b>continent</b>	Large land masses which with the exception of Antarctica are made up of a group of countries. The seven continents are Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Europe, North America, Oceania and South America.
<b>ocean</b>	A very large stretch of sea, one of five oceans of the world – Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Arctic and Southern.
<b>direction</b>	Where someone or something is pointing or moving.
<b>capital</b>	A city where a region's government is located.
<b>compass</b>	A special tool that helps you know what direction you are facing. It has four main directions which are north, south, east and west. Part of the compass (the needle) will always point north.
<b>country</b>	An area of land with boundaries which fits within a continent.
